



**Masters of Regional & Community Planning
Non-Baccalaureate Program
Kansas State University**

The Program

Study leading to the five-year Non-Baccalaureate Master of Regional and Community Planning degree requires a minimum of 150 credit hours, of which a minimum of 48 credit hours are graduate level credit hours, plus a required internship in planning experience. Support courses are offered within the College of Architecture, Planning and Design, as well as well as from other colleges within the university. Students entering the College of Architecture, Planning and Design will typically complete the first year of the Environmental Design program, during which they will elect to enter one of the four available degree programs (Master of Architecture, Master of Interior Architecture, Master of Landscape Architecture, and Master of Regional and Community Planning) or another program offered in other colleges. Transfer students may apply for entry into the MRCP program at any time.
