The Program

Study leading to the two-year Post-Baccalaureate Master of Regional and Community Planning degree, requires a minimum of 48 graduate credit hours, which includes 35 core credit hours and a minimum of 12 specialization credit hours. In addition, it is recommended that all planning students seek an internship in planning experience during the summer between the first and second year of course work, which may be added to their Program of Study above the 48 credit hour minimum if the student so desires. International students seeking the MRCP degree are required to complete a 1 credit hour Internship course (PLAN 805), increasing their degree requirements to 49 credit hours. Support courses are offered throughout the university, subject to the approval of the faculty.

A program of study must be filed by all graduate students pursuing a master's degree. The program of study is a planning document developed by the student, the major professor, and the supervisory committee, which outlines the course work that the student must complete in order to develop adequate expertise in "planning" and be awarded the MRCP degree.
